Tuesday March 21
in St. Helena Capt
Gross meets the ship
and goes on shore a
gain

Wednesday March 22nd

This day the prisoners
that were put in jail
was fourteen of them put
on board the ship by the
police and two of them
consented to go to duty
the other eleven refused to
turn too they was put
in irons and put below
six men was sent on
shore from shore to put
the ship under way weighed
anchor at one o'clock P.M.
left the harbor Capt Gross
goes on shore after getting
the ship under way leaving
her in charge of Mr Johnson
the first officer the Boat
Sweepers and 4 men before
the mast was found to
be the prison leaders in the
mutiny they was left on
shore to be discharged
as will probably be seen in
the marros journal

Thursday March 23rd

This day we stand in
to the island of St Helena
and take Capt Gross
and Mrs Gross and little
Boy on board and take
our departure from
the island of St Helena
steering by the wind
our harbor look heading
east the cook Mrs
Cherique sauce one of
the mutineros turn too
at six P.M. promising
Capt Gross that he would
be obedient and try to
pull up the lawful command
of the ship and do his duty
he was released from
his chains immediately
but the other 9 refused
to turn too and part
of them used profane
language to the Capt and
was very insubordinate
to Capt Gross

Friday March 24th

This day was moderate
the mutinizing crew was
released at 7 a.m. from
the irons and given all
the water and bread they
wanted. After wards was
examined by Capt Gross &
and only one consented to
turn for Manuel Gross
Lobo promising he would
be obedient and do his duty
he was released from his
irons immediately
