July 1st Saturday this day good weather sehr agate in sight so ends this day
lat 9.18 S lon 9.55 E

Sunday July 2nd this day good weather sehr a gate in sight
Mr Gohr coxswain a sailor takes sick he is under medical treatment
lat 9.40 S lon 10.45 E

Monday July 3rd this day was pleasant weather sehr agate in sight off the beam backed ship at 5.30 P M headed to westward on port tack
lat 10.06 S lon 10.45 E

Tuesday July 4th this day was good weather see humpbacks and black fish at night took in topgallant sails and flying jib heading to south east
lat 10.10 S lon 10.16 E

Wednesday July 5th this day was pleasant all the first part of the day latter part was windy and rough agate in sight see black fish lat 10.20 S lon 10.11 E

Thursday July 6th this day was quite fresh breeze from south with rough sea laying on port tack heading to westward sehr agate in sight stern of us see black fish
lat 10.42 S lon 8.27 E

Friday July 7th this day was good weather with rough sea from south sehr agate in sight laying on western tack
lat 11.14 S lon 7.22 E

Saturday July 8th this day was pleasant weather with rough sea sehr agate spoke us at two P M Mr Gohr coxswain the sailor that took sick on July 2nd has been well treated with medical aid according to the best of the capt's judgment this disease was not the regular pleurisy but something like us to it he had pains in the chest pointed mostly to the left side with slow fever he was phisicked with castor oil and after was given balsam life she was fed from the cabin table with such food as the capt thought best to give to strengthen him he is now much better he is in no pain and the fever
