Monday October 26th no observation
First part of this day light
wind latter calm and light wind
ship steering to the S. heavy swell
from the S.E.

Tuesday October 27th Lat 32.50 N Lon 27.49 W
This day calm with heavy
swell from the S.E. ben seen
main topsail

Wednesday October 28th no observation
This day light breeze from
the W ship steering to the S. ben
new main topgallant sail foresail fore
topsail and jib two sails in sight

Thursday October 29th Lat 31.22 N Lon 27.11 W
This day Calm

Friday October 30th no obs
This day light wind from
the S.E. ship lay the wind on starboard
tack heading to the S.E. roved new
topsails braces and fore brace

Saturday October 31st no obs
This day light wind from
the S.E. ship steering to the S.
Roberts off duty

First part of this day light
breeze from the W latter part strong breeze
ship steering to the south saw sunfish

Monday November 2nd no obs
This day strong breeze from
the N ship steering to the S.E.

Tuesday November 3rd Lat 25.29 N Lon 24.25 W
This day light wind and calm
ship steering to the S.E. made new
spanker wings

Wednesday November 4th Lat 24.14 N Lon 24.42 W
This day calm saw black fish
one sail in sight made new footropes
for jib and flyjib

Thursday November 5th Lat 23.42 Lon 24.40
This day light wind from the
S.E. ship heading to the S.W. saw
Grampases

Friday November 6th Lat 22.56 Lon 25.58
This day light wind from
the S.E. ship heading to the S.W.
Roberts off duty
