- Saturday November 7th Lat 21.05^N Lon 26.42^W
 This day light wind from the E. ship steering to the S saw Grampuses
- Sunday November 8th Lat 19.33^N Lon 26.25^W
 This day strong breeze from the N. E. ship steering S. E. by S. at 4.30 P. M. raised sperm whale four points of lee bow going to windward quick lare three boats no chance boats return to ship again so end
- Monday November 9th Lat 18.17 Lon 25.26
 This day fine weather wind from the N. E. ship steering to the S. W. by S. saw Porpoises saw two sails one bound N. the other S.
- Tuesday November 10th Lat 17.10^N Lon 24.47^W
 This day fine weather all day light raise the Island off St. Antonio ahead 30 miles of ship by the wind on Port tack heading S. at 4 P. M. went round heading to the N. E. land six miles off
- Wednesday November 11th Lat 17.03 Lon 24.31
 This day fine weather at 3.30 P. M. anchor in St. Antonio Robredo off duty

 This day light wind all sail set steering to the south Cooper and Robredo off duty
