Saturday November 28th Lat 4.55 Lon 23.55 W
 This day light wind and rain squall at 7.30 A.M. raised sperm whales going N. N. E. lured three boats W. B. struck one small whale got it L. B. struck large whale iron draw got whale to ship at 4.30 P.M.

Sunday November 29th no obs
 This day calm and rain cut in the whale and cut the blubber and head in harness

Monday November 30th Lat 5.09 Lon 23.52
 Calm all midnight sperm whales around the ship going to the N. W. at day light light wind made sail and started N. W. until noon see nothing a steamer in sight bound S. W., hoist out the whale

Tuesday December 1st no obs
 This day light wind shifts by the wind on Port tack heading from S. to S. W.

Wednesday December 2nd no obs
 This day light breeze all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading from S. to S. W.

Thursday December 3rd Lat 3.22 Lon 24.08 W
 This day light breeze all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading S. to S. W. one sail in sight clean and paint the anchor

Friday December 4th Lat 2.40 Lon 24.58
 This day light breeze all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading from S. W. to W. one sail in sight stow down 15 lbs sperm oil

Saturday December 5th no obs
 This day calm with heavy rain squall

Sunday December 6th no obs
 This day light wind from the S. all sail set working to the S.

Monday December 7th Lat 2.20 Lon 25.22
 First part of this day light wind all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading from S. W. to W. latter part calm and rain

Tuesday December 8th Lat 1.54 Lon 26.02
 This day light from the S. E. all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading to the S. W. one sail in sight bound N.
