Monday March 15<sup>th</sup> Lat 17.16 Lon 11.46  
This day strong breeze under short sail saw finback

Tuesday March 16<sup>th</sup> Lat 16.21 Lon 10.34  
This day strong breeze under short sail steering to the N. W.

Wednesday March 17<sup>th</sup> Lat 15.58 Lon 10.35  
This day strong breeze under topsails steering to the N. E.

Thursday March 18<sup>th</sup> Lat 15.28 Lon 11.24  
This day fine weather all sail sett steering to the E saw white water

This day fine weather all sail sett steering to the E. by N saw finback Porpoises & algerien

Monday March 22<sup>nd</sup> Lat 13.25 Lon 12.27  
This day fine weather all sail sett steering N. E. by E. land in sight saw a schooner bound N.

Tuesday March 23<sup>rd</sup> Lat 12.34 Lon 11.12  
This day fine weather steering to the N. W. cleaning iron works

Wednesday March 24<sup>th</sup> Lat 11.56 Lon 11.28  
This day fine weather steering to the N. E. saw blackfish. cleaning and painting iron works second mate of duty sick with rheumatism
