Thursday March 25th Lat 11 35 S Lon 12 00 E
 This day fine weather steering to the E. saw blackfish porpoises and algersees at 5.30 P.M. raised large sperm whale going to the S.E. no chance did not lose

Friday March 26th Lat 11.22 Lon 12.25
 This day fine weather first part heading to the E latter to the N.W. saw porpoises and grampases cleaning and painting iron work

Saturday March 27th Lat 11.06 Lon 12 15
 This day fine weather heading to the N.W. cleaning and painting iron

Sunday March 28th Lat 10.57 S Lon 11.58 E
 This day fine weather first part on western tack latter to the E.

Monday March 29th Lat 10.45 Lon 11.48
 This day light breeze by the wind on Port heading to the W. painting ship saw Porpoises
 The Captain saw bread floating along side went forward there was lots in the pigs tub he then went down in the fore cabin there he found several pieces meat on the deck he also found a half bag bread in Frank Goomes bunk he is kept on deck three days
 Arthur Xavier de Souza is kept on deck 6 days for throwing a gun stone over board

 This day light wind and calm steering W.S.W. braking out and stowing after hole

Saturday April 3rd no obs
 This day fine weather with light wind all sail set by the on Port tack heading W. by N.

 This day fine weather with light wind all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading W. by N.
 Second mate still very sick
