- Monday April 5th Lat 10.25 S Lon 6.24 E
This day fine weather with light wind all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading from W. S. W. to W. employed over hauling blocks second mate still sick
- Tuesday April 6th Lat 10.57 S Lon 4.51 E
This day fine weather with good breeze all sail set by the wind on Port tack heading W. by S. overhauling block Second mate still very sick
- Wednesday April 7th Lat 12.04 S Lon 3.02 E
This day fine weather with whole sail breeze all sail set heading to the W. S. W. saw Cowfish employed scraping and washing mast
- Thursday April 8th Lat 13.22 S Lon 1.31 E
This day fine weather all sail set by the wind on Port heading W. S. W. Second mate still very sick
- Friday April 9th Lat 14.57 Lon 00.20 W
This day strong breeze heading to the W S W employed washing ship
- Saturday April 10 Lat 16.17 Lon 2.09 W
This day fine weather first part steering W latter steering N W by W by W Second mate still very sick

This day strong breeze steering N. W. at 5.30 P. M. raise St Helena 30 mile at 6.30 huff to on Port tack under short sail Second mate still very sick

- Tuesday April 13th
This day strong breeze 10.50 A. M. anchor in St Helena harbour the second is taken on shore to the Hospital the eight stow away is taken on shore and ship by the Consul
- Wednesday April 14th
in St Helena employed washing ship outside
- Thursday April 15th
in St Helena employed painting yards
- Friday April 16th
in St Helena painting ship outside
- Saturday April 17th
in St Helena painting the mast
