This day begins with fresh winds from S.E. lying off and on at St. Helena and the Capt on shore sick and the watch employed ship duty.

Tuesday May 4: 18:97

This day begins with light winds from S.E. lying off and on at St. Helena the Capt on shore at 5 P.M. the ship was of Jamestown at 6 P.M. back of shore take in light sails heading by the wind E. by N so ends

Wednesday May 5: 18:97

This day begins with fine weather from S.E. lying off and on at St. Helena at 5 P.M. the Capt came on board with a famule, so ends

Thursday May 6: 18:97

This day begins with fine and pleasant weather from S.E. lying off and on at St. Helena with all hands on board so ends this day; Lat 15:55 Long 5:42

Friday May 7: 18:97

This day begins with fine weather from S.E. at 10 A.M. Capt went on shore to see the American Consul but means desert in St. Anthony Cap Verd Islands at 4 P.M. came on board at 5:30 P.M. sail from St. Helena so ends this day No Ob.

This day begins with fresh breezes from S.E. with cloudy weather steering N.W. by N at 9 A.M. got the tables over the hatch and got out Rice and beans the rest of the day employed ship duty at 4 P.M. Washed top decks so ends

This day begins with fresh winds from S.E. steering N.W. by N at 1 P.M. the Mate told John Bragg to go to the matchbox and he refused to go, and he told the Mate a threat for punishment so Capt called him aside and told him to go to the mast head and he refused to go and began to make noise and the Capt told him to stop and stop his noise and he told the Capt he would not so the Capt told the Mate to put him in irons and take him up to the head of the boat but he was released from his irons in 20 minutes with the order standing to Obey orders
