This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from S. E. steering North by North in sight at day light got up tackle and brot out water and the rest of the watch employed setting up top mast raised so ends this day.

This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from S. E. At 1 A. M. sighted Island of St. John at day light wore ship and set up fore top sail

Saturday May 15: 18:97

This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from S. E. at day light set fore top sail and main top sail and steered for the Island at 10 A. M. sent two boats fishing at 1:30 P. M. saw Sperm whales going to Windward did not lower the boats for them at 4 P. M. the two fishing boats came back and made all sail and worked to windward tack and tack so ends.

Sunday May 16: 18:97

This day begins with fresh winds from N. E. at day light took ship to South heading S. W. at 1 A. M. saw Sperm whales at noon lower 3 boats for them at 1 P. M. S. Boat struck and S. Boat struck and got ^{capsized} over and lost the chole gave one hand lance but de W. Boat and S. Boat saved the whale and got the two whales to the ship at 5:30 P. M. Hoisted the boats and got aboard at 7:30 P. M. sent the watch so ends this day.
