Monday May 17: 18:97

This day begins with light winds from S. E. at 5:30 A. M. In late all hands got up cutting gear at 7 A. M. saw large sperm whale 2 miles off shore 2 boats L. B. and W. Boat W. Boat struck and gate stove and lost the whale bay the line parting at 9:30 A. M. Hoisted the boats at 10 A. M. began cutting at 1 P. M. got one whale in age got dinner at 4 P. M. finished cutting and made all sail and wore ship to southward and sent the cutting gear down and got ready to boling at 6:30 P. M. got supper and set the watch at 7 P. M. and the watch employed mincing blubber so ends this day No Ob.

Tuesday May 18: 18:97

This day begins with fine and Pleasant weather from S. E. betuning up to windward with all sail set at 9 A. M. took in the W. Boat and the Capt and the Cooper repairing the boat and the rest employed in cutting up blubber and oil the hogs at 2 A. M. started the works at 5 P. M. washed of decks and the watch employed hoiling and set the watch at 7 P. M. so ends this day
