This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from E. S. E. crossing of the Island but saw nothing at day light got up tackles and got work bread and the watch employed ship duty, so ends.

This day begins with light wind from the E. crossing of the Island but saw nothing and the watch employed ship duty so ends.
