Wednesday August 11: 18:97
This day begins with fine weather from NW at 11 P.M. finished boling at day light got up cutting gear and put some oil below at 9 A.M. began to cut got the heads up and part of the hazy and parted one chene and lost one chene of one the upper cutting blocks at 8: P.M. got softer and saw the watch so ended this day.

Lat 31-26 Long 51-08

Thursday August 12: 97
This day begins with fine weather from SE at 8 A.M. started all hands and got back light and finished the block at 9 A.M. began to cut again at 1 P.M. started the work and the watch employed boling and the rest employed cutting at 1 P.M. finished cutting the rest of the day employed boling and cutting up blubber with the heads on the side at 7 P.M. got softer and saw the watch one steamer in sight so ended this day.

Lat 32-36 Long 51-11

Friday August 13: 18:97
This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from S.E. heading S.E. by S. the watch employed boling after brack fist all hands employed cutting up

Blubber and getting ready to tack on the heads at 6 P.M. got the heads on and belled the case, middle and latter part the same so ended.

Lat 32-35 Long 51-10

Saturday August 14: 97
This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from S. S.W. heading S. S.E. at 8 A.M. got brack fist the rest of the day all hands employed in cutting up junk and boling and Cooper cutting up checked at 4 P.M. finished boling so ended this day.

Lat 32-35 Long 51-01

Sunday August 15: 97
This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from the W. at 7 A.M. got brack fist at 8 A.M. all hands employed stowing down oil and Cooper sitting up coaks at 6:30 P.M. got softer and saw the watch so ended this day.

Lat 32-39 Long 51-12

Monday August 16: 97
This day begins with fresh winds from the W. heading by the wind W. N.W. at day light the watch employed in the after hole stowing down oil middle part the same at 9 A.M. made sail and steered N.E. at 5:30 P.M. saw 2 sperm whales
