Saturday August 28:97

This day begins with Clear and Pleasant weather from the South at day light made all sail and steered North by N. after break fast took dinner took on fore the bow boat Dave at 4 P.M. washed up decks one sail in sight so ends
Lat 33-41 Long 51-17

Sunday August 29:18:97

This day begins with Squally and rainy weather from S. at day light made sail and steered N. by N. middle part heavy rainy and wind latter part more moderate wind from the Westward at sundown took in all the sail but main top sail fore stay sail and main stay sail so ends

Monday August 30th:97

This day begins with rainy and Squally weather from S.W. at day light made sail and steered S. by N. middle part little more moderate at sundown took in sail and wore ship to Northward heading N.W. by N. latter part Clear weather from the same one Steamer in sight so ends;

Tuesday August 31:18:97

This day begins with light breeze from W.S.W. heading by the wind N.N.W. at 11 P.M. saw whale supposed to be sperm whale at day light made sail heading by the wind N. by W. all day but saw nothing the watch employed watching the ship out side and cleaning up ram the masts at sundown took in sail so ends this day.

Lat 34:33 Long 49-23

Wednesday Sept 1:18:97

This day begins with heavy Squally and rainy weather from W.W. heading by the wind W.S.W. at noon the day heavy Squall and rainy from Northward took in all the sail but 2 low top sails at 1 P.M. made sail and steered Southward at sundown took in sail so ends;

Lat 34-04 Long 49-58

Thursday Sept 2:18:97

This day begins with strong winds and rainy Squally weather from S.W. heading by the wind S. S.E. middle and latter part more moderate at sundown took in sail so ends this day;

Lat 33:40 Long 50-10

Friday Sept 3:18:97

This day begins with Clear and Pleasant weather from S.W. at day light made all sail
