Tuesday Oct. 12: 18:97

This day begins with light winds and clear weather from S. heading S.W. by W. at day light made all sail heading the same the rest of the day the watch employed ship duty at sundown took in all the sail but the two lower topsails latter part light breeze from the same.

Lat 30:18 Long 76:28

Wednesday Oct. 13: 18:97

This day begins with fresh winds from N.E. N.E. at day light made all sail heading S. at 8 A.M. wore ship and steered N.W. and began to petting the Cabin and the watch employed ships duty at sundown took in all the sail but the two lower topsails and Tilt and wore ship heading E.S.E. so ends

Lat 30:31 Long 77:10

Thursday Oct. 14: 18:97

This day begins with strong winds from N.E. heading by the wind S.E. by E. at daylight set for and hauled up topsails and foresail and Tilt after brack for the watch employed ships duty and petting the Cabin at 5 P.M. finished petting and Washed of decks at 6 P.M. took in the two up topsails and Tilt heading S.E. with very strong N.E. winds and heavy seas so ends this day.

Friday Oct. 15: 18:97

This day begins with strong Gale from N.E. with heavy seas from the same at 7 A.M. set the foresail and the fore lower topsail heading by the wind S.E. by E. middle and latter part the same so ends this day

Lat 29:33 Long 76:41

Saturday Oct. 16: 18:97

This day begins with fresh winds from the Eastward heading by the wind S. S.E. at 7 A.M. wore ship and set all the topsails Tilt and Spanck heading by the wind N.E. at sundown took in two up topsails on Spanck, latter part breeze moderate so ends

Lat 29:10 Long 76:24

Sunday Oct. 17: 18:97

This day begins with clear and pleasant weather from the Eastward heading by the wind N.E. at day light made all sail middle and latter part more moderate at sundown took in the light sails and the main sail heading the same. So ends.

Lat 30:19 Long 75:41

Monday Oct. 18: 18:97

This day begins with strong Gale from the Eastward heading by the wind N.E. at noon heavy rain and seas from the same at 4 P.M. wore ship to the Southward heading S. S.E. latter part the same so ends.
