and John Brabo he died last night at 10:30 P.M. and at 1 P.M. today held a prayer over him and committed him to the dip in the Care of the Lord; the breeze of this day vary strong winds and rain from the same at 4:30 P.M. took in foresail and fore top-sail and came too on Starboard tack the two sick men very sick to night so ends this day. No anchored by taken sick again to night

Sunday Oct 24: 18:97

This day begins with little more moderate winds from E. N.E. with heavy seas from the same at 6 A.M. died one man by the name Antonio Freitas at 1 P.M. held a prayer over him and committed him to the dip in the Care of the Lord. Middle part moderate winds from the N. N.E. at 4:30 P.M. strong and heavy gale from N.W. had to tack on all the sail but fore top stay sail and reef main stay sail latter part the same strong winds and heavy seas and rainy the two other sick men bout same two more men tack sick to day; Antonio Alves and Alberto Siccira with same disease; so ends this day;

Monday Oct 25: 18:97

This day begins with little more moderate winds from W. S.W. heading by the wind N.W. with two staysails set at 8 A.M. wore ship to South and set the lower main top sail and steered E. by N. at 10 A.M. set the foresail and the lower fore top sail at 1 P.M. set the up main top sail and steered E. N.E. at 4 P.M. heavy squall from the South took in up main top sail this day the sick men little better latter part the same so ends;

Tuesday Oct 26: 18:97

This day begins with light winds from the South at day light made all sail steering E. N.E. at noon saw Steamer Long Shades ahead at 4 P.M. saw rather a steamer bound to North Star at 4:30 P.M. steering Course N. Middle and latter part the same the sick little better to day Antonio Alves and Alberto Siccira on duty again so ends this day;

Wednesday Oct 27: 18:97

This day begins with light winds from E. N.E. steering Course N. at noon ^{the wind} veered to N.E. with severe rain squalls took in main gabbante sail Middle part the same rainy; at 5 P.M. the wind all to E. N.E. steering Course N. by W. with clear weather so ends the sick men better to day
