 this day begins with clear and

 from E. N.E. steering N. by W
 middle part calm the watch
 employed tack the tennys out
 the boat latter part light breeze

 Northward today saw one Steamer
 bound to Northward the sick men
 little better to day so ends this day.

Friday Oct. 29: 18:97
 this day begins with fresh winds
 from N.W. heading by the wind N.
 N.E. at noon wind veered to N.
 N.W. with heavy squally with
 rain and wind at 4:30 P.M. took
 on main gallant sail flying till
 7:00 P.M. took mainsail and the
 up fore topsail and wore ship to
 the Westward heading W. N.W.
 the sick men bout same to day
 last night saw Steamer bound
 to N.E. so ends this day;

Saturday Oct. 30: 18:97
 this day begins with fresh breeze
 from N.W. heading by the wind W
 by N. at 1 P.M. the wind ll to N
 W at 1:30 P.M. wore ship heading
 by the Wind N. N.E. with all sail
 set this day employed tacking in
 the Centing Stagger and Centing Par-
 ties the Sick Men little better to
 day saw 2 Steamers one Sail so ends.

 P.M. light breeze from S.W. steering
 N. by W with main gallant sail set
 the Sick men little better to day so ends
 Lat 38:23 Long 71:35

Monday November 1: 18:97
 this day begins with fresh breeze from
 the Southward with heavy wather steering
 N. N.E. with main top gallant sail
 set after brack fiste got racy and
 sent the fore gallant mast up
 and the watch employed getting
 up and satiny up the rig on middle
 and latter part light rain at 8 P.M.
 hove the lee and found 50 fadams
 water the Sick today bout the sa-
 me 8 Sick men all tol; to day
 saw Steamer and one Sail so ends

Tuesday November 2: 18:97
 this day begins with rain and foggy
 wather from S. S.W. heading N.E.
 by N. N. and rain all day at 3 P.M.
 light up little with the light breeze from
 the Eastward at 4 P.M. sighted the
 the Long Island bout 30 miles off
 saw ^{several} sails and Steamers latter
 part the same the watch com-
 ployed senting the fore gallant
 Arley up at 5 P.M. finished the
 Sick men bout the same the
 Capt has bin given to them the
 medicine 3 times a day so ends.
