This day a light breeze from the W the barque steering E by N under all sail the first part the middle and latter a good breeze the barque steering E N E under all sail employed in ships duty saw one sail so ends this day

9 Friday this day a light breeze from the NW the barque steering by the wind the middle and latter a light breeze from the S E employed in breaking out bread and raised a school of Whales and bore 3 boats at 10.30 a.m. and at 11.30 a.m. the W.B. struck and the other boats chase of so ends this day

10 Saturday this day commenced with a light breeze from the E the barque chasing Whales and chase them until dark and the W.B. got the whale along side at 3 P.M. and cut him in the middle and latter a light breeze from the N E employed in cutting up blubber and started boiling at 10 a.m. so ends this day

11 Sunday this day commenced with a light breeze from the N E and got through boiling at 6 P.M. the middle and latter a strong breeze from the S E the barque steering by the wind under short sail so ends this day

12 Monday This day a strong breeze from the S E the barque steering by the wind the middle and latter the same employed in setting up the main topmast stay and stow down oil we stow 154 gallons of oil and finish the platform so ends this day

13 Tuesday this day commenced with a light breeze from the S the barque steering by the wind the middle a light breeze and saw the Island of Flores at 8.30 a.m. and the barque beating to the windward open a cockpit so ends this day. Buf Lat

14 Wednesday this day a light breeze from the S the barque beating up to the Island and at 6.40 the land bore S E about 30 miles distant the middle at latter squally weather the barque still beating for the Island of Flores and saw one Steamer and one sail so ends this day

15 Thursday this day commenced with squally weather with a little rain the barque beating to the windward under short sail at dark a strong breeze from the S E the land bore S E about 10 miles off at dark the middle heavy rain the latter a light breeze from the S the barque steering in for the land and bore the S B the Captain and Wife went in boat they would not let them Land and would not let them have any thing come on board at 11.30 and made all sail fore Saindecine so ends this day 2 Steamers in sight

16 Friday this day a light breeze from the N.W the barque going a round Flores and came to anchor at 8 P.M. at Saindecine lying to anchor at Flores and the mate on shore employed in breaking out Flour a new cask and one Steamer passed by in the night so ends this day
