

17 September Saturday

This day a light breeze from the N.E. the barque lay in to anchor at Flores. The Captain and Wife and Anton Edwards on shore and board a few Potatoes and Onions the mate came on board at 4.40 P.M. and got the ship on the way the Captain and Wife on shore fore the night so ends this day

18 Sunday this day a light breeze from the S the barque lay in of and on at Flores the captain and wife and one man on shore so ends this day

19 Monday this day a light breeze from the S the barque lay in of Flores the Captain and Wife came on board and the man at 4.20 P.M. at dark sent the boat and got 4 men the middle and latter a good breeze from the S.W. and raised a School of Whales and bore 3 boats at 7.20 A.M. and at 8.20 the W.B. struck and got the Whale along side at 9.40 A.M. and commenced cutting and got him in at noon Flores in sight so ends this day Lat

20 Tuesday this day a strong breeze from the W.S.W. the barque steering S.E. half S under short sail employed in cutting up blubber and started boiling at 5 P.M. the middle a strong breeze from the S.W. the barque steering S.E. by S under short sail and steer for the Islands and sight Fyall at 7 A.M. and had a little rain and boiling still and lay in between Fyall & Pico and saw one Schooner and one Steamer so ends this day Lat

21 Wednesday September

This day a light breeze from the N the barque lay in of Fyall and got through boiling at 5 P.M. and made a little sail the middle a strong breeze from the S.W. the barque steering in fore the land and came to anchor at 8 A.M. and got ready to broke out oil and started to break out at 2 P.M. so ends this day

22 Thursday this day a strong breeze from the N the barque lay in to anchor at Fyall the men Forward refuse duty the Council came on board and had them put in irons and put down the hold and send men from shore to break out the oil and ship it on board the May Macfarlan me with 154 bbls and at 5 P.M. took the anchor and made a little sail and steer S by W so ends this day

23 Friday this day a light breeze from the N.W. the barque steering S by W under short sail employed in stowing away the Cable and 6 men turn to duty and the other three are still in irons so ends this day Lat

24 Saturday this day a strong breeze from the N the barque steering S by W under all sail the other three men turn to duty employed in ships duty and repairing the Foretop mast Stear sail and doing other jobs so ends this day Lat
