- 13 Wednesday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. the middle and latter the same employed in ships duty and still laying of and on at St Vincent so ends this day
- 14 Thursday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. and at dark we made a heavy thunder storm and then it blew a moderated gale for 8 hours so that we made to lay under our main top sail the latter made the a strong breeze and the barque are still laying of and on at St Vincent so ends this day
- 15 Friday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. the barque laying of and on at St Vincent employed in ships duty
- 16 Saturday this day a strong breeze from the E. the first part the middle and latter a light breeze from the N.E. the barque laying of and on at St Vincent employed in ships duty so ends this day 5 Steamers in sight
- 17 Sunday this day a light breeze from the N.E. the first part the middle and latter a strong breeze the barque laying of and on at St Vincent so ends this day
- 18 Monday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. the middle and latter the same the barque laying of and on at St Vincent a fine Steamer in sight employed in ships duty so ends this day

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- 19 Tuesday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. and laid up to the town the Captain came on board and anchored the ship and we anchored at 5 PM so ends this day
- 20 Wednesday employed in taking water we took 10 tun and broke out a new cask of Port 156 gal. 4 1/2 bbls and also the mate came on board baggage so ends this day
- 21 Thursday this employed in ships duty and one boat steered and the cook and 10 seamen departed and the mate on shore so ends this day
- 22 Friday this day employed in ship duty and the Captain Croster arrived at St Vincent and they caught 12 deserters and got them in jail and the mate on shore so ends this day the Boat steered Victor Simon Deserter
- 23 Saturday this day employed in ships duty and brought a board 11 men that deserted and kept them in rows for the night and the ship are still in anchor the new Captain are in charge and the mate are on duty so ends this day and three men got clear and put one seaman as cook Anton Gilman
- 24 Sunday this day employed in taking the anchor and the men turn to their duty after we took the anchor it hid out a carn so we tore 3 boats and towed the ship out so ends this day
- 25 Monday this day a light breeze from the N.N.W. the barque steering by the wind under all sail and the Islands in sight so ends this day
