

- January 1900
- 7 Sunday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. the barque are still laying to anchor and the Schooner at St Nicholas so ends this day
- 8 Monday this day we took the anchor from St Nicholas and steer to under short sail and got 6 Seamen ^{and} Frank M Freitas as boat steerer also the Schooner came out and tore 2 boats for Blackfish but with out success so ends this day and open a cask of Bread 356 gal Lat 16.32 N Long 24.33 W
- 9 Tuesday this day a strong breeze from the E the barque is of St Nicholas and the Schooner and saw one Stumpbuck employed in giving the men stops and doing other jobs so ends this day Lat 16.38 Long 24.18
- 10 Wednesday this day a strong breeze from the E the barque laying to anchor on St Lucia and got ^{two} seamen the latter star to the westward under all sail and saw the Schooner and spoke her and St Antone in sight so ends this day Lat 16.53 Long 25.16
- 11 Thursday this day a good breeze from the E the barque cruising of St Antone also the Schooner employed in breaking out Molasses and one school of Black fish in sight so ends this day Lat 17.45 Long 26.14

- 12 Friday this day a light breeze from the N.E. the barque cruising under short sail employed in ships duty one sail in sight so ends this day Lat Long
- 13 Saturday this day a strong breeze from the N.E. the barque cruising under short sail employed in ships duty and 3 sails in sight so ends this day Lat Long
- 14 Sunday this day a fresh breeze from the N.E. the barque cruising of St Antone with the land about 4 miles of so ends this day Lat 17.08 Long 25.09
- 15 Monday this day came the first and middle the latter a strong breeze from the N.E. the barque laying to under fore main top sail and St Nicholas in sight so ends this day Lat 17.05 Long 25.13
- 16 Tuesday this day commenced with a strong breeze from the N.E. the barque laying to under easy sail all day and St Nicholas in sight at day light so ends this day Lat Long
- 17 Wednesday this day a light breeze from the E.N.E. the barque cruising under short sail saw one school of Black fish employed in breaking out one barrel of Beef and an abiding sennett so ends this day Lat Long
