- 8 Thursday this day a mained breeze from the E the barque sailing WNW under short sail and also spoke the Joseph Manto and one Steamer in sight employed in ships duty so ends this day

- 9 Friday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering to the westward all day and at dark shorten sail and came to the wind on the Port tack employed in ships duty so ends this day

- 10 Saturday this day a light breeze from the E the barque cruising under short sail and saw a School of Blackfish and bore about and got two fish and saw a large Breach but never saw it again so ends this day

- 11 Sunday this day a light breeze from the E the barque cruising under all sail saw Grampers employed in salt meat and St Anton in sight so ends this day

- 12 Monday this day a light breeze from the N.W the barque cruising under all sail and the Pedro Vearla in sight and raised a school of Whales and bore 4 boat and the Schooner bore 3 boats the Schooner got 2 and the barque got 3 and got them along side at 10 P.M. so ends this day

- 13 Tuesday this day a light breeze from the E the barque laying too with two Whales along side employed in cutting them in and got through it at 1 P.M. and clean them and started boiling a ton also the Schooner so ends this day

- 14 Wednesday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque cruising under short sail employed in boiling and got through at 4 A.M. the latter stow down and stow 735 gallons so ends this day also spoke the Schooner

- 15 Thursday this day a light breeze from the N the barque cruising under all sail saw one Linback and St Anton also spoke the Schooner and a merchant ship and took a little oil from the Schooner so ends this day

- 16 Friday this day a strong breeze from the N.E the barque cruising under short sail and got six barrels of oil from the Schooner she was mated with us and stow it down so ends this day the Schooner in sight
