- 23 Friday this day came the first part the middle and latter a light breeze from the W the barque cruising under all sail employed in making sperm gum and doing other jobs so ends this day

- 24 Saturday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering to the Westward under all sail at dark shortened sail employed in ship's duty, so ends this day

- 25 Sunday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering W.N.W under all sail employed in breaking out Floue gauge of cash 195 gallons so ends this day and one sail in sight

- 26 Monday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering W.N.W under all sail employed in breaking out one barrel of Beef and doing other jobs so ends this day

- 27 Tuesday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering W.S.W the first part the middle and latter steer W by S under all sail employed in ship's duty, so ends this day

- 28 Wednesday this day a light breeze from the N.E the barque steering W by W the latter raised a school of Sperm whales and chase them with the ship and received another school to the leeward at noon so ends this day

- 29 Thursday this day a strong breeze from the N.E the barque chasing Whales and bore 4 boats the L.B.B. B.B. struck and got them a long side at dark the latter cut them in and got through at noon so ends this day

- 30 Friday this day a strong breeze from the N.E the barque lay too employed in clearing the heads and cutting up blubber and started boiling at 9 P.M. the latter pumping salt Water and still boiling and spoke the Adelia Chase with 20 bbls so ends this day

- 31 Saturday this day a strong breeze from the N.E employed in boiling and got through at noon and stowed down 47 bbls and two sails in sight so ends this day

- 1 Sunday this day a strong breeze from the N.E the barque steering in the S.W and at dark shortened sail and the Schooner in sight so ends this day

- 2 Monday this day a light breeze from the E the barque steering to the Westward and raised a school of Sperm Whales and bore 4 boats and the S.B. W.B. B.B. struck and got them along side at 6 P.M. and made them fast for the night the Schooner and two barques in sight so ends this day
