from the S the barque steering under
all sail and raised a whale at 6 A.
M. and lost 3 boats but the Black
fish got a foul the whale and
gutting him the boat got along side
of him but he got away and we

this day a light breeze from the S.P. the
barque steering E.P.E. under all sail
employed in ships duty and spoke the
A.R. Tucker billings and repairing the
B.B. so ends this day

under all sail employed in breaking
out Flour and 2 sails in sight
so ends this day

Kathleen with 350 bbls also the Tucker
so ends this day 1 Steamer in sight

sail employed in ships duty the A.R.

had very nice letter
