This day begun with light breeze and foggy weather dark going on the port tack under short sail Latter part fair weather at the hour 18 raised a three large sperm whales got boats ready and lowered Waist Boat got fast 20th hour and killed him when ship raised two more whales and the Starboard Boat got one got then alongside at 23.30 o'clock. one sail in sight

First part fine weather started to get the whales in and ^{started boiling} spoke the Bark Canton with 250 bls. of oil Latter part fine weather. Cutting the whales.
