First part of this day strong breeze and rain raised a school of whales close to the vessel lowered three boats and the schooner lowered two but without being successful. Latter part strong breeze with strong wind and rain squalls.

First part of this day strong breeze and squally weather both laying to on the starboard tack. Raised a ~~two~~ sperm whales and lowered for them and the B. B. got fast and the whale took his line later on the L. B. and W. B. got fast on the same whale and killed him and brought him along-side at dark. Latter part strong and rough seas could not cut in on account of the seas.
