First part of this day heavy gale from the S.W. blowing stopped boiling and put the blubber down the hold latter part moderating started the try works again

Friday 28

First part of this day fair weather and fresh breeze bark 1 steaming E.S.E. saw the the Island of Flores & Corvo in sight. Latter part lowered a boat a Fayal Grande. And hauled up chains and

Saturday 29

First part of this anchored in Santa Cruz and the captain, second mate and a boatster went ashore. Latter part lying at anchor nothing to do.

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Sunday 30

This day lying at anchor at Santa Cruz started to blow hard and had to let go the second anchor.

Monday 31

First part of this day lying at anchor the captain and second mate and boatster came aboard to get under weigh but wind would not let us. Latter part succeeded in getting away and started to Fayal.

Tuesday 1

1903 September 1903

First part of this day light breeze and fair weather bark steaming S.E. by S. Latter part light breeze steaming S.E. sighted Fayal and Pico.

Wednesday 2

First part of this day light breeze. dropped anchor in Fayal. Latter part putting up breaking out gear.

Thursday 3

First part of this hauled vessel into the bay and made her fast. Latter part broke out junk cask and got ready to break out oil.

Friday 4

First part started to break out oil a sailor by name Nicholas Stanton went ashore to the hospital with rummation.

Saturday 5

This day employed in setting up casks and painted chains.

Sunday 6

All hands went on shore
