This day begun with light winds and clear weather winds from S.S.E. vessel going by the wind on port tack. Latter part Wind from E.S.E. vessel heading south saw a school of blackfish.

First part of this day almost calm with rain squalls. lowered down three boats to try the crew. Latter part Clear weather and fair breeze vessel going on port tack heading S.W. Employed in breaking out.

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Thursday 5

First part of this day clear weather and fair breeze vessel going on port tack heading W.S.W. saw something which looked like sperm whale spouts run for it but did not see them again. Latter part fresh breeze with squalls vessel on port tack heading S.W.

Friday 6

First part of this day fresh breeze from S.S.E. vessel going on port tack by the wind. Latter part strong S.E. trades heading S.W. by W. Employed in doing odd jobs.

Saturday 7

First part of this day fresh S.E. trades vessel going by the wind on port tack St. Paul's rocks in sight off the starboard beam also felt a slight volcanic shock at about 5 o'clock. Latter part light breeze from S.S.E. / vessel going on port tack by the wind.

First of this day light winds from S.E. vessel heading S.W. by W. Latter part fresh breeze heading same.
