First part of this day strong breeze from S. E. vessel steering N. E. Killed one pig. Latter part same kind of weather a whaling bark in sight supposed to be the Dunteam.

First part of this day wind moderating a little still very high seas the bark to leeward of us whaling later on saw a big school of sperm whales raised them off deck got the boats ready but did not lower as they were going very fast to the windward Latter part fresh breeze bark under short sail on port tack saw a number of white waters but vessel could not get near enough to find out what they were
