First part of this day light winds bark cruising under all sail employed in sewing sails one whaling bark and a steamer in sight. Latter part fresh breeze saw land.

First part of this day fresh breeze and hazy weather employed in putting up the old sails and stowing away the new. Latter part light winds broke out another cask of sails and stowed away the old sails one sail in sight.

First part of this light winds and pleasant weather spoke the Bark Sunbeam at about 4 o'clock raised a couple of white-waters and some spouts from the Sunbeam run off for them but saw nothing more of them. Latter part same kind of weather one sail in sight employed ships duty.
