This day begun with strong N. E. trade winds and cloudy weather bark steering N.W. saw grampus and finbacks. Latter part strong breeze and heavy rain squalls. steering N.W. by N.

This day begun with strong N. E. trade winds and heavy rain squalls. bark steering N.W. Filled one casks of rain water. Latter part same sort of weather. bark steering N.W. by N.
