First part of this day fresh N. Winds bark cruising under upper topsails stowed down the oil which amounted to 20 bbls. Latter calm weather moved off decks and started to set up fore and main gallant rigging

First part of these 24 hours calm weather employed in fixing gallant rigging. Latter part light winds set up lower main rigging

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Friday 5

First part of this day light southerly winds bark cruising under all sail one sail in sight. Latter part fresh breeze and pleasant weather spoke English four masted barkentine Reform and got some late papers.

First part of this day fresh southerly winds bark running to the eastward employed in setting up foretopmast rigging. Latter part same weather saw something looked like a sperm whale spouting run for it but did not see any more

First part of this day fresh S.W. winds bark running to the eastward raised a school of sperm whales lowered 4 boats and each boat got one and got them alongside at dark. Latter part had some rain squalls and cut in whales one sail in sight.

First part of this day light S.W. Winds employed in boiling. Latter part same weather employed in boiling and getting casks ready to put oil
