Wednesday 28th

This day began with lighter winds and mild weather bark steering E. by S. Latter part almost calm raised a school of sperm whales and lowered 4 boats but they were going very fast into the S.W. and we had no success.

First part of this light winds from S.W. bark steering E. by S. spoke bark Platina boiling. Latter part light winds and hazy weather bark steering E. under upper topsails. saw a few pieces of squid. broke out flour.

First part of this day fresh S.E. winds and hazy weather bark steering E. Latter part some weather saw some finbacks and porpoises.
