Cut in the whales and started boiling.

This day began with light trade winds and fine weather bark cruising under ~~upper~~ topsails employed in cutting up blubber and boiling one sail in sight. Latter part winds freshening some and a little rougher. Bark cruising employed in boiling and stowing some empty oil casks in after ~~to~~ hold.

First part of this day fresh winds bark cruising under whole topsails saw a few spouts at about 6 P.M. by supposed they were finbacks employed in running down oil and got through boiling. Latter part strong breeze and rough seas employed in stowing oil.
