Friday 1

First part of this day light winds from the E. S. E. and cloudy weather bark steering by the wind on port tack under upper topsails one sail in sight and to the westward. Latter part same weather passed a whistling buoy that was adrift.

First part of this day light easterly winds and fine weather bark steering by the wind on starboard employed in doing odd jobs. Latter part winds hauled into the south bark steering E. S. E.

Sunday 3

This day began with light southerly winds changing into the S. W. bark steering E. S. E. all sail out. raised one large sperm whale off deck going to the West but did not lower. Latter part strong westerly winds and cloudy weather bark steering E. S. E. employed in ~~at~~ scraping mast and doing various other jobs.

This day began with strong westerly and cloudy weather and rain bark running E. S. E. by E. with all sail out. later took in everything but lower topsails latter part weather moderated made some more sail.

Tuesday 5

This day began with light winds from North later dying to calm. weather cloudy employed in doing odd jobs. Latter part sprung up fresh breeze and at daylight raised land and at 10 dropped anchor in Fayal.

First part made bark fast. Latter began to break out oil.

Thursday 7

Discharged some oil and braking out all the time.

Friday 8

Put off another lighter load of oil.

Saturday 9

Employed in breaking out oil and discharging.

Sunday 10

Pleasant weather. nothing doing.
