Begins with light air from the westward
heaving S.E. off. Thunder and lightning
all about us. One month too since I
came on board. And a hard month to
for me. I hope they all will not be as
sore sick as this has been. Latter part fine
Breezes from W. & W. Course S.E.

Remarks Sunday June 26th

Begins with pleasant breezes from S.W.
Course S.E. Saw Black Bird at night.
Shortened sail and luffed too. Latter
part pleasant breezes from W. & W. Course
S.E. Saw a Dark line steering S.E. This has
been a long lonesome day. Home I wish
I could be there. I believe I should be crazy
before half of the voyage was past, if I
felt as I do now.

Lat-32-17 Long 53-44

Remarks Monday June 27th

Begins with pleasant breezes from
W. & W. Course S.E. Saw one Pin. Black.
and a Dark. Suppose her a whalman.
At Sundown shortened sail and luffed too.
Latter part fresh breezes from the westward.
Steering E. Saw a whaling ship.

Lat-31-53 Long 52-40

Remarks Tuesday June 28th

Begins with fresh breezes from west.
Course E. At 5 P.M. luffed too and to
the S.W. at Sundown shortened sail.
Latter part moderate breezes from W. Course
S.E. Saw two whaling schooners.
Make one. The Chas. A. Higgins of
Provincetown.

Remarks Wednesday June 29th 1870

Begins with moderate breezes from the
westward. heading S.E. at 8 P.M. a bump
passed very near us. lightened very sharp.
Latter part light breezes from W. Course S.E.

Begins with moderate breezes from W. Course
S.E. Saw a schooner. At Sundown
shortened sail. Latter part moderate and
fine.

Lat-30-15 Long 49-44

Remarks Friday July 1st 1870

Begins with light breezes from W. & W.
Course S.E. Saw Grampuses. Latter part
light air.

Lat-32-59 Long 48-46

Remarks Saturday July 2nd

Begins with light air from S.E. to W. & W.
Course S.E. at Sundown shortened sail.
Latter part light breezes. Course N.E. by E.

Lat-33-40 Long 48-06

Remarks Sunday July 3rd

Begins with light breezes from S.E. Course
N.E. Saw a Merchant ship heading S.W.
Latter part light air from S.W. Saw
a number of pieces of Cut-Squid.

Lat-34-40 Long 47-20

Remarks Monday July 4th

Begins with light air from S.W.
Course N.E. A heavy swell running
from the N.W. Saw ship heading by
to the scattered. Latter part moderate
breeze from S.W.

Lat-34-53 Long 46-29

Remarks Tuesday July 5th

Begins with moderate breezes from W. Course S.E.
by E. Mr Stuart is sick. I think inflammation of the
bowels. Latter part more breeze. Mr Stuart is
better.

Lat-35-43 Long 45-26
