Remarks Saturday Sept 3rd 1870
 Begins with moderate breezes from N.W.,
 heaving by to the N.E. at sundown tacked
 to the N.W.ward. Saw a ship heading to the Eastward.
 Latter part - wind N.W., heading by to the Northward.
 Lat 31-14 Long 27-32

Remarks Sunday Sept 4th
 Begins with pleasant breezes from N.W., head
 to the N.E. At sundown made the Island of
 Pico bearing N by W Dist 50 miles. Tacked to the
 W & W. Latter part - moderate breezes from N.W.,
 at 2 A.M. tacked to the Northward.
 Lat 31-46 Long 27-42

Remarks Monday Sept 5th
 Begins with moderate breezes from N.W., heading
 by to the N.E., at 6 P.M. East End of Pico bearing
 N Dist 20 miles. West End bearing N.W., tacked
 ship to the W & W. Saw four ships. Latter part -
 strong breezes from N.W., heaving up to Pico,
 at noon bearing N.W. Dist 25 miles.
 Lat 32-12

Remarks Tuesday Sept 6th
 Begins with strong winds and heaving from
 N by W to W & W. At 7 P.M. the West End
 of Pico bearing N.W. Dist 25 miles. Pico Dist
 12 miles. Middle part - strong winds. At 6 A.M.
 Pico bearing N.E. Wind at N.W. I thought to have
 got in to day. But it blew a moderate gale,
 wore ship. And stood off, gave it up for a bad
 job. After beating two weeks to get here.

Remarks Wednesday Sept 7th
 Begins with a moderate gale from W & W.
 heaving off shore to the W. under double
 reefed mains. And close reefed fore & aft sails. Land
 Dist 30 miles. Latter part - fresh breezes
 steering for Pico. At 9 at off the Harbour.
 And went on shore for for letter
 got about 25 for my crew home for
 my self. So ends Boat On shore.

Bark Alfred Gibbs, toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Thursday Sept 8th 1870
 Begins with fresh breezes from W & W.
 At 6 P.M. having my recruits on board, I
 got into the boat and pulled along shore a
 short distance, stole three men and returned
 to the Bark. Made sail and bid adieu to
 the Islands and started on my voyage. No letter
 and I can't say. Latter part - fresh breezes from
 W & W. Course S.E. Lat 38-09 Long 26-26.

Remarks Friday Sept 9th
 Begins with fresh breezes from W & W. Course
 S by E 1/2 E. all sail set. Discharge yesterday
 Charles Anthony sick. Latter part - moderate.
 Lat 36-24 Long 24-21

Remarks Saturday Sept 10th
 Begins with light breezes from W & W.
 Course S by E. Saw Grampuses.
 Latter part - pleasant breezes.
 Lat 34-44 Long 22-49

Remarks Sunday Sept 11th
 Begins with pleasant breezes from W & W.
 Course S by E. At 6 P.M. Spoke the Scos,
 E. Bonnell of Provincetown 130 bbls Cannon Meets.
 Latter part - some squally. Wind from N.E.
 Lat 33-01 Long 21-19

Remarks Monday Sept 12th
 Begins with moderate breezes from N.E.,
 Course S by E. Weather overcast. Latter
 part - light breezes, and a heavy swell from
 the N.E. Saw one sail. Lat 31-44 Long 20-24

Remarks Tuesday Sept 13th
 Begins with light breezes from N. Course
 S by E. Saw one sail. A heavy swell running
 from N.N.E. Latter part - light breezes
 from N.E. Employed painting iron
 work. Lat 30-36 Long 18-38
