Remarks Sunday Jan 1st 1871

Begins with strong winds from the westward and squally. Steering S by E for the Island of Huafu. At 2 P.M. raise bearing by compass S by E. 10 miles. Wear ship and blades off N.W. under double reef. Latter part strong winds and thick weather. Course N.W. by N. under double reef. Lat 37-37 Long 75-59

Barometer 30 1/2

Remarks Monday Jan 2nd 1871

Begins with strong winds from W to E and thick weather. Course N.W. under double reef. Made a straight-facket for the Crazy Man. we have had him in trans two days. He hurt his wrists so we had to confine him in a facket. Latter part wind S.W. by S. Course N by W. Barometer 30 1/2 Thermometer 58°

Lat 37-15 Long 76-14

Remarks Tuesday Jan 3rd

Begins with pleasant winds from the southward, but a heavy swell. Course N. Latter part fresh breezes from the S. Steering N. saw three sails two of them whalers.

Lat 37-15 Long 75-15

Remarks Wednesday Jan 4th

Begins with strong winds from the South. Spoke the bark Morning Star, Allen 100 Am. and B.K. Parula Capt. Sherrick 25 months 1100 Am. at 8 P.M. put away N.W. at 5 A.M. luffed to head to the S.W. Latter part strong winds from S.E. under double reef main top sail, close reefed. Bare and Bare sail.

Lat 35-59 Long 75-53

Remarks Thursday Jan 5th

Begins with strong winds from S by E. heading by the wind under double reef main top sail, close reefed. Bare and Bare sail. at sundown furled the Bare sail. saw a piece of squid. Latter part a strong Gale from the S. heading by to the E. under close reefed top sails.

Lat 35-52 Long 75-52

Bark Alfred Gibbs, Cruising off Maubie.

Remarks Friday Jan 6th 1871

Begins with strong gale from S by E. heading by to the Eastward under close reefed top sails and Bare sail. saw a whaling bark steering off to the W.N.W. Latter part moderate from the S. and foggy. saw cut squid, and one black.

Lat 35-41 Long 75-10

Remarks Saturday Jan 7th

Begins with light breezes from the S. with foggy squalls. Latter part moderate breezes from N. saw one sail.

Lat 35-29 Long 74-19

Remarks Sunday Jan 8th

Begins with moderate breezes N.W. spoke the bark Pescadora of Valparaiso. Chase master. Latter part moderate breezes from S. heading to the W.S.W.

Lat 35-34 Long 74-52

Remarks Monday Jan 9th

Moderate breezes from the S. heading by to the W.S.W. sold a boat boat yesterday. and a keg of butter weight 63 lbs. Latter part moderate breezes from S.W. heading by to the W.N.W. Employed fitting a new boat for the Mr. Cranes.

Lat 35-19

Remarks Tuesday Jan 10th

Begins fine weather and light winds from S.W. saw Killer, Perisais and Grampuses. Latter part pleasant breezes from the S. Employed fitting the boat.

Lat 34-52 Long 77-00

Remarks Wednesday Jan 11th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S and fine weather. Latter part wind W.N.W. heading by to the Westward. at 5 A.M. put the new boat on the Mr. Cranes. took in the old one and repaired and painted her to put over head on the beams. saw one sail. supposed it a Merchant-man.
