Remarks Wednesday May 24th 1871
Begins with moderate breezes from S.W.
Course N.W. at night heeled too head to by S.
and shortened sail. One gear out to sea.
Latter part moderate breezes from N.W. repaired
the S.S. Boat. One gear out with 560 lbs oil.

Lat 31-53 Long
Remarks Thursday May 25th
Begins with moderate breezes from N.W.
heading by the wind to the Northward.
Latter part moderate breezes from N.W.
Saw a sail. Lat 31-42 Long 76-04

Remarks Friday May 26th
Begins with light breezes from N.W. saw
killers. Latter part moderate breezes from
the N. set up the blacksmith forge, and
made some haisting straps for the boats.

Lat 31-39 Long 76-30
Remarks Saturday May 27th
Begins with fresh breezes from the N. heading
by to the westward. at 2 P.M. double reefed.
Wind breezing on. has appearance of a gale.
Middle part a gale from the North with heavy rain.
Latter part more moderate and clear.

Lat 31-45 Long 76-45
Remarks Sunday May 28th
Begins with strong winds from the N.W.
Under close reefed top sails. Saw a Darkentine.
Latter part strong winds with heavy squalls
of rain wind and lightning. Saw a Back.

Lat 31-53 Long 75-53
Remarks Monday May 29th
Begins with strong winds from N.W. under
close reefed main top sail. Latter part strong
winds from W. under close reefed top sail.
Saw one hump back.

Lat 31-59 Long 75-28

Remarks Tuesday May 30th 1871
Begins with strong winds from W by S. but
moderating. heading by to the Northward under
close reefed top sails. at 2 P.M. set the fore
sail. Latter part the wind got back to the N.W. and
blew on again. heading to the westward under close
reefed top sails. no ab

Remarks Wednesday May 31st
Begins with a gale from N.W. at 2 P.M. the
hauled to the W.S.W. in a rain squall, and the
wind moderate, but continued raining. Barometer
29.85 Middle part moderate and rainy. Latter part wind
hauled back to the N.W. Lat 31-30 Long 75-35

Remarks Thursday June 1st
Begins with fresh breezes N.W. with a heavy
swell from S.W. heading to the W.S.W. at 5 P.M.
shortened sail and wore ship to the N.N.E. saw
hump backs. and cut squice. Middle part
strong wind and squally. Close reefed the top sails.
Latter part moderate from S.W. and rainy.

Lat 31-10 Long 75-12
Remarks Friday June 2nd
Begins with moderate breezes from W
and a heavy swell. heading N.W. at 6 P.M.
light air from W.N.W. saw 16 backs. Killed
a hog. Middle part moderate breezes from N
N.W. Latter part fresh breezes. heading to
the westward. Lat 30-49 Long 75-20

Remarks Saturday June 3rd
Begins with strong winds from N.W. at
1 P.M. double reefed. at 4 close reefed and
wore ship to the N.N.E. hard work to get
to the Northward. Latter part strong winds
from N.W. heading by to the N.E.
Lat 30-40 Long 74-44
