

Dark Alfred Gibbs Cruising off Moreno Head.

Remarks Thursday June 28th 1871
Begins with strong breezes from S by E, heading
to the westward. At 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M shortened sail.
Head bearing E Dist 35 miles. Latter part strong
winds. Ship under two double reefed top sails
and stay sails. Lat 23-28

Remarks Friday June 29th
Begins with strong winds from the S
heading to the eastward. At 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M wore to
the westward. Under double reef. Latter part
Calms and a heavy swell. Land Dist 25 miles.

Remarks Saturday July 1st
Begins with light airs from S and a heavy
swell. Saw 83 Bish. Caught two. ~~MSB 83~~
The Martha in sight. Latter part Calm.

Remarks Sunday July 2nd
Begins with Calms and light airs. Spoke
the Martha. Latter part Calm. Lat 22-58

Remarks Monday July 3rd
Begins with light airs from S by E
heading S E. at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M shortened sail and
wore ship to the westward. Land Dist
25 miles. Latter part fluky and baffling.
Saw Chin. Barks. Lat 23-03

Remarks Tuesday July 4th
Begins with fresh breezes and fluky.
Heading in for the Land. At 5 P M tacked
off. Land Dist 20 miles. Latter part light
airs.

Remarks Wednesday July 5th
Begins with breezes and baffling. Heading in
for the Land. Saw a Steamer bound N. at 4 P M tacked
to the westward. Land Dist 12 miles. Latter part
light breezes from S E. Saw Chin. Barks

Remarks Thursday July 6th 1871
Begins with light wind and baffling from
the S. Latter part Saw Chin. Barks. Light
airs and Calms. Land Dist 60 miles.

Lat 23-32
Remarks Friday July 7th
Begins with light winds from S. heading
S E. at 6 P M the head bearing S by N Dist
50 miles. Latter part pleasant breezes from S.
Heading in for the Land. at noon Land Dist
25 miles. Lat 23-30

Remarks Saturday July 8th
Begins with pleasant breezes from S.
Heading in for the Head. at 4 P M headed off
shore. Land Dist 8 miles. Saw a Steamer
heading to the S. at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M shortened sail.
At 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M Frank fell overboard out of the main
chains. Had the ship been going quick, we
may have lost him. But the wind being
light, and Dark under short sail, she was
going very slow. And the men hearing him,
the Steward threw him a rope, and we hauled
him in. I am very thankful it is so
worse. Latter part moderate breezes.

Remarks Sunday July 9th
Begins with fresh breezes from S.
Spoke the Martha. Latter part light winds
and cloudy. Lat -

Begins with strong breezes and
baffling. Latter part fresh breezes
Lat 23-14

Remarks Tuesday July 11th
Begins with strong winds from S by E.
Heading in for the Land. at 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ P M tacked off the
Land Dist 3 miles. Latter strong winds.
Under double reef. Lat 23-11
