Begin with moderate breezes from S & E,
latter part strong winds from S & E.
Lat 35-33 Long 76-34

Remarks Friday Nov 24th
Begin with strong winds from S & E.
Saw another main top gall sail, so to
repair the old one. Latter part strong winds.
Under two double reef. Lat 35-37 Long 75-08

Remarks Saturday Nov 25th
Begin with strong winds from S. Under double
reef. passed the Bark Warning Star and hailed
her. Latter part moderate breezes and baffling.
Saw Brambles & Porpoises. Lat 36-03 Long 74-20

Remarks Sunday Nov 26th
Begin with moderate breezes from S & W to S.
The morning star in sight. Latter part wind
W & W by S squally. Lat 36-13 Long 74-06

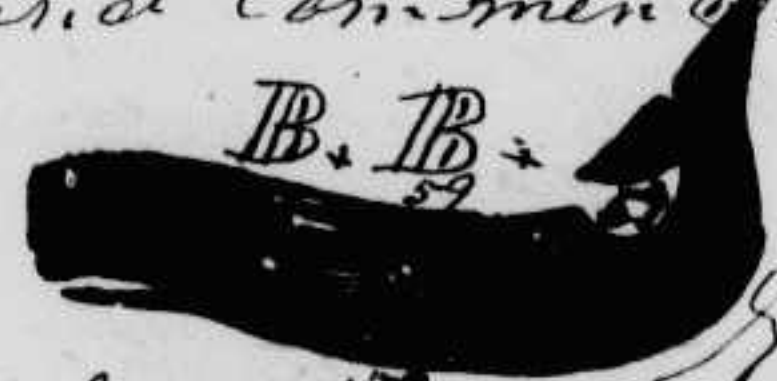
Remarks Monday Nov 27th
Begin with strong winds from W & S by W and
squally. Saw the morning star whaling, got chase.
Latter part calm and a heavy swell. morning star &
and a merchant ship in sight. Lat 36-26 Long 73-50

Remarks Tuesday Nov 28th
Begin with fresh breezes from S and a heavy swell.
after sunrise. The star being about 2 1/2 miles to
the windward of us, ran into a school of whales.
as whale. I think they lowered their boats. But it
was too late to tell certain. We saw nothing except
his manna and his calland. Latter part strong
winds. Under double reef. at 11 A.M. the top of
his boat bearing E by S Dist 15 miles, were ship.
saw the morning star manauvering, ran for
her, but the whales proved to be hump
backs. saw a steamer bound south.

Remarks Wednesday Nov 29th 1871
Begin with strong winds from the south,
under double reef. The morning star in sight.
Latter part strong breezes. at 5-10 A.M. raised whales
all around us. lowered the boats. The off boat
struck one, and cut the line with the 2^d diron,
so that it is parted. The whales turned to the wind
ward. at 10 they turned again to the leeward, lowered
again. no success. so enter boats chasing.
Lat 36-26 Long 73-53

Remarks Thursday Nov 30th
Begin with strong winds from the south.
at 3 P.M. called the boat aboard. at 4 P.M.
lowered again. The 1st boat struck. at 7 P.M.
him along side. latter part strong winds and
rugged. at 5 A.M. commenced cutting. at 10 1/2 finished.
and commenced clearing away the whale.
Lat 36-12 Long 73-47



Remarks Friday Dec 1st
Begin with strong winds from the south.
Employed clearing away the whale whale.
at 3 1/2 P.M. commenced boiling. Latter part
more moderate. Employed boiling.
Lat 36-01 Long 74-01

Remarks Saturday Dec 2nd
Begin with fresh breezes from S. Employed
boiling. Middle part strong winds. took in the
bare sail. Latter part more moderate but breezy.
Employed stowing oil. saw Brambles!
Lat 2 A.M. finished boiling

Remarks Sunday Dec 3rd
Begin with fresh breezes from the south.
and foggy squalls. Latter part strong breezes
under double reef. Lat 35-46 Long 73-46

Remarks Sunday Dec 4th
Begin with strong winds from S by W.
Latter part moderate breezes from S.W. finished
stowing down. Stowed 60 bags Lat 34-04 Long 73-56
