Remarks Saturday August 10th 1872
 Begins with strong winds from N.W.
 at 4 P.M. shake the bark Nant. off and on
 for wood. had taken no oil since we last saw
 her. at 6 P.M. began to rain and blow on middle
 and latter part a Gale with heavy squalls of
 wind and rain. at 5 A.M. wind hauled to the
 S.W. at 7 put off & under two close reefs.

Lat 33-47
 Remarks Sunday August 11th
 Begins with strong winds from S.W. at 2
 P.M. wind hauled to S.E. under close reefs.
 middle part Calm and sea running easy. at
 5 A.M. took a Drugges from N.N.E. Course Eby S.

Lat 33-47
 Remarks Monday August 12th
 Begins with strong winds from N.W. Course
 Eby S. under close reef and bare sail. at
 3 P.M. took in bare sail and bare Cape sail and
 huffed to head to the N.E. set in rain. Middle
 part wind hauled to the Westward and moderate
 latter part moderate Drugges from W. Course S.E.

Lat 34-41 Long 76-30
 Remarks Tuesday August 13th
 Begins with moderate Drugges from N.W. and smoky.
 Course S.E. latter part fresh Drugges from
 N.W. at noon huffed to head to the S.W.

Lat 36-05 Long 75-29
 Remarks Wednesday August 14th
 Begins with strong winds from N.W. and
 thick weather. at 13 P.M. took in the bare sail
 and close reefs. latter part strong winds
 and rainy. heading N.N.E. under close reefs.

Lat 36-16 Long 75-09
 Remarks Thursday August 15th
 Begins with strong winds from N.W. and rainy.
 at 3 P.M. took in the bare Cape sail.
 middle part rainy. latter clear, wind
 N.W. fresh. saw 10 sail.

Remarks Friday August 16th 1872
 Begins with fresh Drugges from S.W. by N.
 saw 10 sail Drugges. latter part moderate Drugges
 from N.N.E. head to the East. Lat 36-19 Long 74-56

Remarks Saturday August 17th
 Begins with moderate Drugges from N.N.E. to N.W.
 saw 10 sail. latter part moderate Drugges from
 N.W. to N.W. S.W. and rainy. no Ob.

Remarks Sunday August 18th
 Begins with moderate Drugges from N.W. by S.
 and varying rain. at 12:30 P.M. raised a school
 sperm whales, gallied by 8 black fish. at 1 P.M.
 lowered the 18 boat. at 2 P.M. the 83 boat
 fastened to one. skinned boat, took his line.
 another boat got fast, killed, at 4 P.M. took
 the whole along side. latter part strong winds
 and very rugged. from N.W. at 7 P.M. N.W. round
 and at 8 P.M. on a heavy swell from S.W.
 made it bad cutting. the boat came down by the run
 three times. once they let it sit. among the lineal
 Part of a chain strap. another the throat. Bagle, that
 we had used all the voyage, for our heaviest
 heaviest. at 10 P.M. we got it in on deck,
 and no one hurt. I am thankful for it. rain
 still increasing. B.D. Lat 36-27. Long 75-00

Remarks Monday August 19th
 Begins with a Gale from N.W. and rugged.
 at 1 P.M. finish cutting. about a 83 barrel
 and a half in the case. at 4 P.M. got it
 over board. and lashed things up for the
 night. latter part more moderate wind
 N.W. at 8 P.M. commenced sailing.
 a heavy swell from S.W.
