Remarks Wednesday March 10th 1873
Begins fresh breezes from S to Course & by N. at sundown. Breeze too weak to the S. E.
Latter part light breezes from the Westward.
Saw 80 fish and Porpoises. The Carver and another whaler in sight. Lat 37-23, Long 74-48

Remarks Thursday March 13th
Begins with light breezes from the West.
Latter part moderate breezes from S. W.
Saw 80 fish. Lat 37-16 Long 75-13

Remarks Friday March 14th
Begins with light breezes from S by W
Saw 80 fish and four merchantmen.
Latter part fresh breezes from S. Saw
80 fish. Spoke the bark Scine. 300
tons.

Remarks Saturday March 15th
Begins with moderate breezes from
S. Latter part moderate from W and foggy.
Saw Sulphur bottoms. Lat 37-06 Long 75-12

Remarks Sunday March 16th
Begins with moderate breezes from W.
and foggy, with a heavy S. W. swell.
Spoke the Carver. Latter part strong
winds from N. W. Lat 37-31

Remarks Monday March 17th
Begins with a Gale from N. W. at
2 P. M. took in fore sail and fore top
sails. The wind hauled to the S. W.
in a squall. Saw a whaling bark.
Latter part moderate from S. W. with
a heavy swell. Lat 37-41 Long 75-26

Remarks Tuesday March 18th 1873
Begins with moderate breezes from S. W.
with a heavy swell. Saw two whalers.
Latter part light air from S. W.

Lat 37-22 Long 75-06
Remarks Wednesday March 18th
Begins with light air from W. S. W. and
heavy S. W. swell. Saw 80 fish, the Carver
and suppersce Platina in sight.
Latter part Calm. Lat 37-06 Long 74-50

Remarks Thursday March 20th
Begins with Calms and a heavy S. W. swell.
Spoke the Carver. The vessel was saw
yesterday was the Cape Horn. Pigeon.
Latter part moderate breezes from S.

Lat 36-53 Long 74-48
Remarks Friday March 21st
Begins with Calms and heavy S. W.
swell. Saw the Cape Horn. Pigeon and
a merchant bark. Latter part strong
winds from S. W. with a heavy S. W. swell.

Lat 36-53
Remarks Saturday March 22nd
Begins with a moderate gale from S. W.
and a heavy S. W. swell. Rain. Under
close reef. Main top sail and top sails.
head to the S. W. Latter part moderate
breezes and squally.

Lat 36-58 Long 74-55
Remarks Sunday March 23rd
Begins with fresh breezes from S. W.
by S. Steering for Valparaiso. At 1 P. M.
Spoke the Mary & Susan.
