Remarks Thursday Thursday April 24th 1873
Begins with a North W. at 12 1/2 P.M. took
Cher Anchor to beat out of Valparaiso.
At 5 1/4 P.M. passed the S. end of Deseriguena.
at 7 P.M. the wind hauled to the S.W. in
a squall of rain. Middle part drizzling and
light. Latter part wind to N.W. light
with a heavy swell. Spoke the Mary &
Susan. She sailed at the same time.
at noon the light house on Deseriguena
in sight. Lat 36-36 Long 73-27

Remarks Friday April 25th
Begins with light air N.W. by N. and
a heavy S.W. swell. at 5 1/2 P.M. Mary &
Susan in sight, bearing S by E. The Mary & Susan
in company. Latter part moderate breezes
from N.W. heading S. a heavy S.W. swell
we have two passengers, an Man & wife,
and Dog. Lat 37-18 Long 74-30

Remarks Saturday April 26th
Begins with light air and calm.
and a heavy S.W. swell. have new main
top sail & braces. Latter part strong wind
from W.S.W. at 11 1/2 A.M. took in. Top. Gall
sails. weather thick Lat 38-29 Long 75-08

Remarks Sunday April 27th
Begins with strong winds from W.S.W.
and thick weather. heading by to the S.
under top sails. Latter part moderate
breezes from S.W. heading by to the West.
Lat 38-19 Long 76-02

Remarks Monday April 28th
Begins with moderate breezes from S.W.
heading by to the W. by N. Latter part strong
winds at 6 1/2 A.M. hauled to the N.W.
Lat 38-10 Long 76-28

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Remarks Tuesday April 29th 1873
Begins with strong winds from S.W. heading
W.S.W. at 1 P.M. hauled to the S.E. at 2 P.M.
double reefed the fore top sail. The passenger
still sea sick. Latter part moderate from S.W.
heading S.E. Lat 39-43 Long 75-55

Remarks Wednesday April 30th
Begins with light breezes from S.W.
heading by to the S.E. at 6 P.M. wind hauled
to the N.W. heading S. made a berth for
the passenger. Barometer falling. stands at
30 1/10. Latter part strong breezes from the
westward and rainy with a heavy head
swell. Barometer 29 9/10. at 9 A.M. double
reefed. Lat no obs.

Remarks Thursday May 1st
Begins with strong winds from W. the
westward and thick. with a heavy head
swell. under double reef and courses & furl.
Barometer 29 9/10. at 6 P.M. wind hauled
to the S.W. latter part moderate. at 8 A.M.
took a light breeze from S.W. course S.W.
Barometer 30 1/10 Lat 41-35 Long 76-36

Remarks Friday May 2nd
Begins with moderate breezes from S.W.
course S.W. all drawing sails set.
weather thick. Latter part fresh breezes
from W.S.W. Barometer 29 9/10

course S. all drawing sails set.
Barometer 29 9/10. weather thick.
Latter part light breezes from S.W.
heading by to the S.E. Lat 45-35 Long 79-17
