Remarks Sunday June 29th 1873

Begin with fresh traces from N E by E.
Course N W. All sail set.
The bark still in sight. 4 miles astern
of us. been in sight 6 days. rather
even sailing. Latter part strong
traces. At 10 P. M. took in rags & some
main. Cap. Ball set sail. The
bark still in sight. astern dist - 10
miles. Lat 11-17 Long 48-35

Remarks Monday June 30th

Begin with strong traces from N E
by E. Course N W. Bark under
Cap. Ball sail. The other bark
in sight. astern dist - 8 miles. Latter
part fresh traces. Lat 13-19 Long 48-28

Remarks Tuesday July 1st

Begin with fresh traces from N E by
E. Course N W 1/2 N. The bark
still in sight. off the lee quarter dist -
8 miles. Latter part moderate traces.
Employed painting. Lat 15-31 Long 50-58

Remarks Wednesday July 2nd

Begin with moderate traces from
E N E. Course N W 1/2 N. All drawing
sails set. Latter part moderate traces.
Lat 17-39 Long 53-25

Remarks Thursday July 3rd 1873

Begin with fresh traces from N E by
E. Course N W 1/2 N. All sail set.
Latter part fresh traces from E N E.
Lat 19-54 Long 55-36

Remarks Friday July 4th

Begin with moderate traces from E by N.
Set a sail steering westward. Our
course N W 1/2 N. Employed stowing away
all milk casks. Latter part light traces
from E N E to E S E. Lat 21-49 Long 57-41

Remarks Saturday July 5th

Begin with light traces from E S E.
Course N W 1/2 N. Latter part light
druses from S E. Lat 23-16 Long 59-22

Remarks Sunday July 6th

Begin with light druses from
S E. Course N W 1/2 N. Latter part
light druses from S E. Lat 24-08 Long 60-19

Remarks Monday July 7th

Begin with light druses from
S E. Course N W 1/2 N.
Latter part light air from S E by E to
E S E. Lat 24-31 Long 60-59
