This voyage commenced from N.B. Aug. 14, 1877.

Mary & Susan off St. Mary

Remarks Tuesday April 12th 1880
at 4 P.M. Civil time took the anchor
and sailed from the Port of Paloahuano
on a Cruise. And I hope it will be
a fortunate one. This week was a
lucky one last voyage and I trust
will be again. We will now
change the time to Sea Account
by calling it the first part of the 13th.
Fresh breezes from S by E. and rough.
Latter part strong winds.

Lat 36=38 Long 75=06

Remarks Wednesday April 13th
begins with strong winds from S by E.
Latter part strong winds from S S E.
Under close reef and bare sail.

Lat 36=38 Long 76=49

Remarks Thursday April 15th
First part strong winds from S S E
heading by to the Eastward. Latter part
more moderate.

Lat 36=32 Long 75=19

Remarks Friday April 16th
First part fresh breezes from S. heading
by to the Eastward. Saw a Chile Bark
with the name Hugo on her Quarter.
Latter part light air from the Westward and foggy.
at 10^{1/2} cleared off. Saw the Land dist 40 miles

Long 73=50 Long 36=40

Remarks Saturday April 17th
First part light air from W. We saw the
Cohn & West. the Land in sight at 4 P.M.
set in thick. Latter part strong winds from
the N.W. and thick weather. heading to the
N.E. at 10^{1/2} A.M. were shot to the N.W.
Bar 29^{7/10} No clear.
