Remarks Sunday April 18th 1880.

First part a Gale from the N.W. and thick
leading to the S.W. under close reef. At 4 1/2
P.M. took in the fore top sail. The ship
in sight off the lee quarter. Latter part
light breezes from S.W. and Calms.
Land in sight. Lat 36=43 Long 74=05

Remarks Monday April 19th
First part light air and Calms with a
bad swell. The ship in sight. Latter part
light air from the S.

Lat 36=35 Long 73=48
Remarks Tuesday April 20th
First part light breezes from S. heading E by S.
The Land in sight. Dist 25 miles. Latter
part light air from S.W. by and Calms. Land in
sight. St. Mary Dist 10 miles. Lat 36=42 Long 73=43.

Remarks Wednesday April 21st
First part light air from the W. heading
to the N. Land in sight. Dist 25 miles.
Latter part light breezes from W. to S. and
thick weather. Lat 36=35 Long 73=54

Remarks Thursday April 22nd
First part moderate breezes from the
S. and thick weather. At 5 P.M. passed
the bark P.A. Brown the oil bark
for New Bedford. Latter part moderate
breezes from S.E. and heading in for the
Land. Lat 36=34 Long 73=17

Remarks Friday April 23rd
Begins with fresh breezes from S by W.
At 4 P.M. bomb bearing S.E. by E
Dist 10 miles. got an Altitude to rate the
Cher found her 38 miles to the west.
Latter part strong Course W by N. under double
reefs. Lat 35=25 Long 75=56

Remarks Saturday April 24th 1880

Remarks First part strong winds from
S.E. Course W by N. under double reefs.
Latter part fresh breezes from S.E. at 9 A.M. made
Juan Hernandez bearing N.W. by W. Dist 50 miles.
Lat 34=13 Long 78=16

Remarks Sunday April 25th
First part fresh breezes from S.E. Course
W by N. At 6 P.M. Juan bearing bearing
N.W. Dist 15 miles. Latter part fresh winds
at 7 A.M. Juan Dist 2 miles. At 10 stood
off shore to the Eastward. Wind S.E. by S.
Lat 33=34 Long 78=35

Remarks Monday April 26th
Begins with strong winds from S.E. by S.
at 5 1/2 P.M. Juan Dist 4 miles bearing W
S.W. heading to the Eastward under double
reefs. Latter part moderate. At 7 1/2 A.M. the boats
went in shore for wood. got off three cards. At
then got so rugged had to give it up.
at Noon Land Dist 2 miles.

Remarks Tuesday April 27th
First part becalmed under the lee of the Island.
At 6 P.M. Dist 3 miles. strong tide setting
to the Westward. The bark Napoleon in
company. Middle and latter parts baffling air & Calms.
at Noon the Land Dist 3 miles.

Remarks Wednesday April 28th
First part light air from S to E. and Calms.
12 1/2 sent in the boats for wood. still to rough.
Latter part light air and baffling with Calms.
at 7 1/2 the boats went in for wood. got off
the remaining 3 cards. Ship a long way
off shore. The Napoleon working to.

at Noon the Land Dist 3 miles.
