the track Dist 1 mile got same altitudes.
found the Chronometer had varied 22 miles
one East the other West in 14 days. we
then put away S. & E. for Abingdon.
Latter part fresh breezes. at 10 PM. No advent in
with two boats fishing at Abingdon.
got two boat loads. the J.P. West fishing
also.

Remarks Tuesday Sept 21st
Moderate breezes. at 5 PM on the boats
got off to the ship. had to throw
some of the fish overboard for lack
of salt. Latter fresh breezes with fog squalls

Remarks Wednesday Sept 22nd
Begins with fresh breezes from S.E.
heading off to the Eastward. spoke the J.P. West
Latter part fresh breezes from S.E. with
fog squalls. Latter part fresh breezes

heading by the wind to the Eastward.

First part fresh breezes from S. heading
to the E & E under top sail & Curlew. the J.P. West
in company. at sundown shortened sail.
Latter part strong winds. under double reef & fore sail.

Remarks Sunday Sept 26th
Begins with strong winds from the south.
under double reef and fore sail. the J.P. West
in company. Latter part fresh breezes. at 9 PM
No raised a school of sperm whales off the
weather saw going quick to the windward.
at 10 lowered the boats. at 12 the 2 B struck
the W & fastened to the under water. the
Iran was slightly in and drew

Remarks Monday Sept 27th
Begins with fresh breezes. One boat
got to a whale the others chasing. at
10 PM took the whale and boats
along side. at 5 commenced cutting. at
6 finished. the J.P. West in sight.
Latter part moderate. at 9 PM commenced
dailing

Remarks Tuesday Sept 28th
First part moderate breezes. Employed
bailing. the J.P. West just in sight to windward.
at 8 PM finished dailing.
Latter part moderate breezes. and a strong
N.W. current.
