

Remarks Friday Jan 7th 1881.
Strong trades and rugged. Employed Cutting. At 2
P.M. finished. At 5 1/2 finished clearing away the Heads
and started the fire. Latter part strong trades.
Boiling under double reef.

Lat 16-37 Long 81-15
Remarks Saturday Jan 8th.
First part strong winds from S.E. and rugged.
Employed hauling under double reef. Latter part
strong trades.

Lat 16-35 Long 80-15
Remarks Sunday Jan 9th.
First part strong trades. Employed hauling
under double reef. Cap. sails. Latter part strong
trades. At 1 P.M. finished hauling. The whales
turned up 114 Bbls.

Lat 16-37 Long 80-27
Remarks Monday Jan 10th.
First part strong trades. Under double reef.
Latter part strong trades. Employed stowing oil
in the after hold. Under double reef. Cap. sails
Fore sail fiddle & Spanker furled.

Lat 16-58 Long 80-51
Remarks Tuesday Jan 11th.
First part strong winds. Stowing oil.
Under short sail. Latter part strong winds
under double reef. Fiddle & Fore sail furled.
At noon finished stowing oil. Stowed
down 114 Bbls.

Lat 16-40 Long 80-23.
Remarks Wednesday Jan 12th.
Strong winds from S.E. heading E. & E. at 6 1/2
were to the S.W. Latter part moderate.

Lat 16-40 Long 80-17
Remarks Thursday Jan 13th.
Moderate breezes from S.E. Latter part
moderate.

Lat 17-07 Long 80-52

Remarks Friday Jan 14th 1881
Moderate breezes from S.E. heading by to the
westward. At 6 1/2 P.M. backed to the E. & E.
at 5 1/5 A.M. raised a school of whales going N.E. by E. at 7 1/2
breached the boats. They saw the boats and turned to the
windward. The 33 boat took an head & head lay
hooked him with a slight chance and breached.

Lat 17-03 Long 80-22
Remarks Saturday Jan 15th.
Moderate trades. At 4 P.M. Joe Brera while
releasing the mast head forward fell from the
Fore Mast Gallant head to the Deck, taking the fore
top on his descent. When the windlass broke to the Deck.
Heave one side of his skull in, broke one arm and
hip. He was awfully crushed to pieces. He breathed
10 or fifteen minutes. We buried him at 6 1/2 P.M.
Latter part moderate. Saw nothing.

Lat 17-06 Long 80-46
Remarks Sunday Jan 16th.
Light air. Spoke the Matilda. They
had taken 80 Bbls since we saw
them before. Saw 3 or 4 Bbls.

Lat 16-44 Long 80-49
Remarks Monday Jan 17th.
Light air and calm. Latter part
light breezes. Saw 8 Black Chick. Barbares &
3 or 4 Bbls.

Lat 17-02 Long 80-13
Remarks Tuesday Jan 18th.
First part moderate breezes from S.E. heading by
the S.W. Latter part fresh breezes. Saw the
Matilda.

Lat 17-49 Long 80-20
Remarks Wednesday Jan 19th.
First part strong breezes. Took in Cap. Gall sails.
Latter part strong winds. Saw plenty of
Bin Bbls. No ship.

One Bbl
