Remarks Wednesday March 16<sup>th</sup> 1881  
Begin with moderate breezes from S.W. Course  
S.E. Put over the Patent-lag for the first time.  
Malcahuano Dist 95 Miles at 6 P.M. saw a  
Merchant Bark steering to the S.E. Middle  
and latter parts Calm.

Lat 35-27 Long 74-00  
Remarks Thursday March 17<sup>th</sup>  
Begin with a Calm. at 2 P.M. took a light  
breeze from S.W. heading by to the S.E.  
Latter part moderate. Last over Patent  
Lag by a heavy Bock. no Obs.

Remarks Friday March 18<sup>th</sup>  
First part moderate breezes from S.W.  
An. Breeze. at 3 1/2 P.M. the Breeze lifted.  
sighted the light house on Deliriquina  
bearing S.E. by E. at sundown passed  
it. Noe beat about the Bay in Calms  
& light air all night. at 10 1/2 A.M.  
took a light breeze from the W.  
headed W. for the anchorage.  
at 3 P.M. Civil time. Came to anchor  
in the harbor of Malcahuano.

Remarks Wednesday April 27<sup>th</sup>  
Begin with light breeze from the  
E.S.E. at 11 P.M. took the anchor  
and sailed from Malcahuano bound  
home. at 1 P.M. passed Camber Point.  
wind S. at noon passing out the  
S Passage.

Remarks Thursday April 28<sup>th</sup>  
Begin with strong winds from  
W.S. running out of Malcahuano south  
Passage. at 1 P.M. passed Camber  
Point. Put over the Log at 3 1/2 P.M.  
Land Dist 12 Miles. Latter part strong  
at 6 1/2 A.M. reefed the top sails  
Lat 36-49 Long 75-28

Bark Mary & Susan toward Cape Horn.

Remarks Friday April 29<sup>th</sup> 1881  
Begin with strong winds from S.E.  
heading by to the S.W. under double reef courses  
jib & spanker. at 4 1/2 P.M. took the jib &  
main sail and reefed the spanker. The  
Patent-lag gave the Dist exact by the clock.  
latter part strong winds at 8 A.M. more moderate.  
set main sail jib & spanker and let out the  
reefs. saw a Merchant Bark sailing S.E.

Lat 37-09 Long 77-08  
Remarks Saturday April 30<sup>th</sup>  
First part strong winds from S.E. heading  
by to the S.W. under top sails courses jib &  
spanker. Latter part baffling from S.E. to S.W.

Lat 37-16 Long 77-11  
Remarks Sunday May 1<sup>st</sup>  
First part light winds baffling from S. heading by  
to the Westward. Latter part moderate and baffling  
from E.S.E. to S.E. heading by to the S.

Lat 37-59 Long 80-03  
Remarks Monday May 2<sup>nd</sup>  
First part light and baffling from S.E. by E. to S.S.E.  
heading to the Southward. Latter part light air  
and baffling S to S.W. Lat 38-34 Long 80-58

Remarks Tuesday May 3<sup>rd</sup>  
First part light air from S to S.W. heading  
by to the Eastward. Latter part moderate breezes  
from the Westward Course S by E.  
Lat 39-22 Long 80-44

Remarks Wednesday May 4<sup>th</sup>  
First part fresh breeze from the Westward  
Course S by E. at 5 P.M. began to rain. took in  
top gall sails and main royal. Bar 29 85/100  
Latter part strong winds from S. at 8 P.M.  
were ship to the S.W. Latter part under double  
reef.
